**§ 1 Study objective, academic degree**

- (1) The course qualifies students for a professional career in the field of intercultural relations and for transfer to the consecutive Master's programs Intercultural Communication and European Studies (ICEUS) and Human Rights Studies (MAHRS) of the Department of Social and Cultural Sciences at Fulda University of Applied Sciences or to another Master's program in the social sciences.
- (2) The Bachelor's degree program is offered in both German as well as English.
- (3) After passing the Bachelor's examination, the faculty awards the academic degree Bachelor of Arts.

## **§ 2 Entry requirements and admission**

- (1) When choosing the German-language variant and German-language modules, applicants must provide proof of German language proficiency of at least level C1 (DSH-2) of the European Reference Framework. This does not apply to applicants who have obtained their study qualification at a German-language institution or who have already completed a university degree in a predominantly German language.
- (2) When choosing the English-language variant and English-language modules, applicants must provide proof of English language proficiency of at least level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. This does not apply to applicants who have obtained their study qualification at an English-language institution or who have already completed a university degree in a predominantly English language. Students who have no knowledge of German as defined in paragraph 1 are recommended to choose a German language course.
- (3) If the student has the relevant knowledge of German (§ 2 para. 1) and English (§ 2 para. 2); German and English language modules can be selected and combined.
- (4) Admission takes place each winter semester.

## **§ 3 Standard period of study, ECTS credits, deadline for the final thesis**

- (1) The standard period of study is 6 semesters full-time. Part-time study is possible.
- (2) The entire course comprises 180 ECTS points.
- (3) One ECTS point is based on 30 hours.
- (4) The deadline for the final thesis is 9 weeks. It corresponds to 12 ECTS points.

## **§ 4 Modules**

- (1) The degree program comprises 19 compulsory modules and 1 elective compulsory module. The contents of the modules, the number of ECTS points and the respective examinations can be found in the module descriptions (Annex 2). An overview of the distribution of the modules over the semesters of study can be found in the curriculum (Annex 1).
- (2) One of the following modules can be chosen as the elective compulsory module:
  - M15a: Migration und Diversität (SK1127) / M15aE: Migration and Diversity (SK1290)
  - M15b: Arbeit und Interkulturalität in Organisationen (SK1128) / M15bE: Intercultural Relations in Work and Organizations (SK1291)
  - M15c: Globalisierung und nachhaltige Entwicklung (SK1129) / M15cE Globalization and Sustainable Development (SK1292)
- (3) Within the modules MX: Cross Studies (SK1109/SK1271), M11: Views of the Present - Current Topics in Political Science and Sociology I (SK1121/SK1283) und M16: Views of the Present - Current Topics in Political Science and Sociology II (SK1124/SK1287) several courses with different thematic focuses are offered for selection.

### **§ 5 Internship**

- (1) The degree program includes an internship (BPS) of at least 8 weeks in Germany or abroad.
- (2) 20 ECTS points are awarded for the practical phase (including preparation).
- (3) The practical phase is regulated in the regulations for the practical work placement (Annex 3).
- (4) Practical experience such as voluntary work and the development of your own course-related projects can be recognized.

### **§ 6 Repeating examinations, free attempt**

- (1) Within the standard period of study, 4 examinations can be designated once as a free attempt when registering for the examination. These examinations are deemed not to have been taken if they are not passed.
- (2) Within the standard period of study, a total of two passed module examinations can be repeated to improve the grade, of which a maximum of one examination from modules 1 to 10 and a maximum of one examination from modules 11 to 17.

### **§ 7 Weighting of individual examinations and forming of the overall grade**

- (1) The overall grade is calculated from the arithmetic mean of the module grades weighted according to ECTS points.
- (2) Modules X, 5, 9 and 14 are not graded and are therefore not included in the overall grade.
- (3) The work completed in module 18 (final module) is weighted with three times the allocated ECTS points (credits) in the overall grade.
- (4) Academic performance completed outside the curriculum will be certified upon application.

### **§ 8 Entry into force, transitional rule**

- (1) These examination regulations come into force with effect from October 1, 2024.
- (2) Students of this degree program who began their studies before these examination regulations came into force will continue their studies in accordance with the previously applicable examination regulations. This option ends at the end of the summer semester 2027. They can switch to these examination regulations upon application to the Office of Student Affairs. Modules and examinations already completed will be credited accordingly.

## **Annex 3: Regulations for the Internship**

### **§ 1 General**

- (1) The degree course "Social Sciences with a focus on Intercultural Relations" includes a Professional Experience and Research internship. It is prepared and followed up by the Department of Social and Cultural Sciences.
- (2) Students of the degree program "Social Sciences with a Focus on Intercultural Relations" shall independently seek an internship that meets the requirements according to § 4 of the General Provisions for Examination Regulations at Fulda University of Applied Sciences with the Bachelor's and Master's degrees and the respective interests of the students. The Department of Social and Cultural Sciences supports students in their search for suitable internships and in concluding the contract with them.
- (3) The Professional Experience and Research is usually regulated on the basis of a "model contract for the Professional Experience and Research" between the student and the practice location. In exceptional cases, a contract may be issued by the practice location. Before the contract is concluded, it must be submitted to and approved by the Examination Board. It must be ensured that the regulations of § 7 (2) are adhered to.

### **§ 2 Objectives of the Professional Experience and Research Program**

The following objectives are pursued with the Internship:

- Development of practical experience in a field relevant to the course of study;
- Acquisition of knowledge about the tasks and the constitution of the organization in which the internship is completed, as well as about the design of the respective work processes;
- Development of perspectives for further studies and later professional activity;
- Opening of field access for students whose Bachelor's thesis is related to the content of the respective practice center.

### **§ 3 Practice Location**

- (1) The internship can be completed at public institutions and social or economic organizations of any kind in Germany and abroad whose work is relevant to the subject being studied.
- (2) The Examination Board decides whether the requirements according to paragraph 1 are fulfilled.

### **§ 4 Status of Students in the Internship Program**

- (1) The student remains enrolled at Fulda University of Applied Sciences with all the rights and obligations of regular students for the duration of the internship. They are not interns within the meaning of the Vocational Training Act.
- (2) On the other hand, the student is bound by the regulations of his or her practice center, in particular with regard to the accident prevention regulations, the working time regulations and the regulations on the duty of confidentiality.

### **§ 5 Timing and Duration**

- (1) The internship takes place after the 4th semester.
- (2) The internship lasts 8 weeks. In justified exceptional cases, it can be extended at the student's request.
- (3) The Examination Board decides on deviations from the regulations in paragraphs (1) and (2).

### **§ 6 Recognition and Verification**

- (1) The student applies to the Examination Board for recognition of the Professional Experience and Research.
- (2) Proof of completion of the practical work placement is provided by
  - a written certificate from the practice center about the practical training periods and content, in which the completion of the Professional Experience and Research course is confirmed in accordance with the regulations for the Professional Experience and Research,
  - a experience report of around 3,000 words outlining the practical placement, the formal course and the main focus of the Professional Experience and Research.

### **§ 7 Contract on the Internship**

- (1) Before the start of the internship, the student concludes a work placement contract with the placement center. The approval of the Examination Board must be obtained before the contract is concluded.
- (2) The contract for the Professional Experience and Research regulates in particular
  1. the obligation of the student to,
    - a) regularly take part of the internship opportunities offered to her,
    - b) carry out the tasks assigned within the framework of the internship plan carefully,
    - c) comply with the instructions of the practice center and the person appointed by it and
    - d) to comply with the regulations in force at the practice center, in particular the accident prevention regulations and the current working time regulations, as well as to report any absence from the practice location (due to illness or similar) immediately,
    - e) comply with the duty of confidentiality to the same extent as the employees at the practice location,
  2. the obligations of the practice center to,
    - a) employ the student for the period of time to be determined in each case in accordance with the regulations on the Internship,
    - b) appoint a contact person or supervisor for the students,
    - c) give the student the opportunity for appropriate periods of reflection during the agreed working hours.
