Module	M0 Cross Studies
Description	This seminar offers a critical understanding of the emergence of the global South or Third World in International Relations. It discusses the ideational and institutional underpinnings and relevance of the Third World movement in international relations. The course addresses specific issues and concerns of the global South in international relations including the following: the changing nature of North-South relations; the European Union’s development cooperation with African, Caribbean and Pacific States; trends in developmental regionalism; role of emerging economies in the global South.

Module	M7/15c Political Dimensions of Intercultural Relations
Description	The course focuses on the issue of development and the position of the global South in the global political economy. It examines the prevailing development perspectives, including developmentalism, dependency, neo-statism, neo-liberalism, human development, sustainable development, and post-development, and undertakes a detailed analysis of the content and pitfalls of the major development strategies adopted by governments in the global South. The course addresses the challenge of development in the context of the economic asymmetry between the global North and global South in the areas of trade, finance, investment, poverty alleviation, and capacity to promote environmental sustainability. South-South cooperation as a pathway for development will be addressed.

Description	This workshop offers a critical examination of the conjunction of a series of market and political issues in the global political economy. It examines the major theoretical perspectives used to explain the intersection of states and markets in the global economy. It provides an overview of trends in the global political economy, in the areas of trade, foreign direct investment, foreign portfolio investment, China and the Global South, and the state of North-South relations.
