<b>Subject area</b>	Internationally recognised qualification: application and specialisation in theory and practice
<b>Brief description of the course content</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Europe as a supranational structure guaranteed by treaty</li> <li>• Development of the welfare state in Europe</li> <li>• Practice and organisation of social work in different European countries</li> <li>• Language, communication, culture and interculturality. Perspectives of Intersectionality – Dimension of diversity and exclusion: Gender, race/ethnicity, class, sexual orientation</li> <li>• Human rights</li> <li>• Biographical theatre as a possibility for intercultural dialogue and its importance for social work practice</li> <li>• Insight into theatre projects in the context of social work</li> </ul>
<b>Subject-specific fields of competence</b>	<p><b>Unit 1: The policy, politics and structure of Europe (2,5 ECTS)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• European structures (organisations, procedures, treaties, etc.) as well as the most important discussion themes on Europe (orientational knowledge)</li> <li>• The reasons for uniting Europe, analysis of the results (explanatory knowledge)</li> <li>• Migration and ethnisation: theory and social processes</li> <li>• Social work with refugees and migrants.</li> <li>• Sources of additional information.</li> </ul> <p><b>Unit 2: Subject-specific aspects of social inequality and social work with the focus on diversity (5 ECTS)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social work on a European and worldwide level (orientational knowledge)</li> <li>• Conceptions of social order such as gender theory, theory of intersectionality, ethnicity</li> <li>• The processes of social inequality and societal cleavages such as gender, race/ethnicity, work and class</li> <li>• Sources of additional information</li> </ul> <p><b>Unit 3: Fundamental intercultural competences (2,5 ECTS)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Models of culture and diversity, links between language, communication and culture, commonalities and differences (orientational knowledge)</li> <li>• Explaining one's own and other cultures; the causes of intercultural conflicts; dealing with intercultural conflict situations (explanatory and practical/operational knowledge)</li> </ul>

<b>Module code and title</b>	<b>B</b> 1) <b>Field studies in community work with young people</b> 2) <b>Social Work Institutions: visits to get familiar with “good practice”</b>
<b>Duration</b>	3,5 months
<b>Credit points</b>	10 ECTS
<b>Type of examination</b>	Written assignment
<b>Subject area</b>	1) European / intercultural qualification: field studies in community work with young people 2) European / intercultural qualification: “good practice” in the host country
<b>Brief description of course content</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Field studies in community work with young people.</b></li> <li>• Organisation of special internships for English speaking students</li> <li>• Supervision of internship</li> <li>• Assessing/grading the written internship report</li> <li>• project planning, implementation and assessment</li> </ul> <p>Students plan semi-independent projects in cooperation with instructors from the Department of Social Work and instructors from the social work institutions, e.g. street interviews regarding attitudes towards ethnic minorities, social inequality, unemployment, gender, etc., i.e. the most relevant categories of social work clients. Projects support sustainable development in the social work institutions concerned.</p> <p>2) Determining criteria for good practice, assessing different social work agencies</p> <p>After a period of preparatory work, several social work institutions will be visited and questioned on aspects of their “good practice”. Students will write reports on both their visits and the subject-specific assessment of the institutions visited.</p>

<b>Module code and title</b>	<b>C</b> <b>German as a Foreign Language</b>
<b>Duration</b>	3,5 months
<b>Credit points</b>	5 ECTS
<b>Type of examination</b>	Oral and written examination
<b>Subject area</b>	Soft skills
<b>Brief description of course content</b>	German for beginners: vocabulary and grammar for everyday communication
<b>Generic competences</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understanding and using basic German in everyday communication (explanatory and practical/operational knowledge)</li> <li>• A knowledge of sources of learning material</li> </ul>
<b>Type of studies and volume of course work</b>	4 academic hours (*45 minutes) per week of tuition
<b>Start of course</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each summer semester</li> </ul>
<b>Additional comments</b>	Students admitted to the study programme without any German skills are required to pass an examination at the end of the programme which covers the generic competences described above.
